Mrs. Pheor Kamphat is married with three children. She says,

“DPA (SCIAF project) has provided me with training on how to grow more vegetables and put in place a water system so I can water my crops.”

“Pipes are run from the well where the water is drawn and distributed with an electric pump to my field.”

“I am growing more vegetables”

“Before I got help I only grew food for home consumption and now I’m able to grow more and on a bigger piece of land. I can now sell my produce to other villagers and earn an income”.

Because SCIAF was able to help Pheor, she now has options to develop that were not there before.

“Before I couldn’t afford to have piglets but now I grow more and sell vegetables. I have been able to buy piglets. Initially I bought one and I let it grow until it gave birth to nine piglets. When they grow to 50kg I will sell them.”

Fishing became difficult for Pheor and others on the Cesan river as criminal groups used big boats to come to the area and use dynamite to blow up parts of the river to kill the fish and take them away to sell for profit.

“I’d like to express my thanks and deep appreciation for the help you have given to people like us and to say that it has really helped us. Our families have experienced difficult times and you have helped to raise us up.”
