Activity 1 WEE BOX Videos

This activity will reference:

S1/S2 RERC 3-21a

I am aware of the needs of others and my willingness to respond to the spiritual and material needs of others.

Activity 4

Auzila's Zambian Scones



Read aloud or print this page to share Auzila's story, then make some Zambian scones.

Auzila's story

Auzila and her family live in Zambia. She is a very keen cook and scones are one of her favourite things to make. Scones are a popular dish in Zambia, sweet or savoury.

The family all love Auzila's scones. They each take a few for themselves and the rest they sell on the roadside to earn some money.

Auzila cooks the scones using a pit in the ground, which she heats with fire. The heat is variable and difficult to control so she must check them regularly, and use her baking know-how to tell when they are ready.

Although called scones in Zambia, the recipe is similar to what we would call muffins. It's an easy recipe with simple ingredients. Try it out, take a picture, and share it with us.

Auzila's recipe

- 4 cups of flour
- 2 cups sugar
- 4 tsp of baking powder
- 2 cups of cooking oil
- 1 cup of water or milk depending on what is available
- 6 eggs

This recipe makes quite a lot of batter so you can split up the batter into batches with different flavours – try adding 1 cup of raisins, coconut or chopped nuts to the recipe.

1. First put all the dry ingredients in a bowl.
2. Then, mix all the wet ingredients together in a different bowl.
3. Add the wet ingredients to the dry ones, then mix until they are well combined
4. Rub a little cooking oil onto a baking tray to grease it, then sprinkle with flour
5. Create circles of scone mix, then space them evenly across the baking tray.
6. Bake at 190°C (375°F) for 20 minutes.

Activity 5

Global hunger crisis

This activity will reference the following, but the debate and accompanying material can be used at Senior level.

S2 RERC 3-24a

I have experienced opportunities to engage with issues of social injustice. I can describe how Church teaching in this area has affected my response and the responses of others to these issues.

Download the Debating the Global hunger crisis PowerPoint. This activity helps learners engage with the topic and utilises listening, speaking and critical thinking skills. The PowerPoint includes:

- Tips for a debate
- Glossary of key words
- Quotes from Church teaching
- Facts and stats
- Suggested debate questions

In preparation for the debate ask pupils to:

- Take our Kahoot Quiz **“Fact or Fiction: the myths about the global hunger crisis.”**
- Watch the video **‘CST in 3 mins’** to find out how Catholic Social Teaching inspires our work.

We believe that by putting the principles of CST into action, we’re following the example set by Christ and acting in a way that God calls us to.
