









## CAN YOU HELP PROVIDE THE REAL GIFT OF WATER FOR A VILLAGE?

It was a real honour to visit the beautiful country of Ethiopia and to see and learn from project participants how their lives had been transformed with the help of SCIAF supporters.

I was in a remote village in the Tigray region - a region with stunning views and kind and hospitable people. Sadly, also a country suffering the impacts of climate change.

Families shared their concerns over their children spending 4-6 hours each day searching for water and their inability as farmers to water their crops.

Families then shared how their lives had been transformed with the installation of a water point in their village. Access to clean water to drink, cook with, and to clean with was now available. I could see areas of green in the distance as farmers pointed to their crops. Able now to water their crops, they produced food to eat and to sell, and their children now went to school as they didn't need to spend hours each day searching for water.

The whole village had worked hard to get to this point and their lives were truly transformed because of something I had long taken for granted... water.

## **WATER IS LIFE SCRIPTURE**

It is no accident that Jesus uses an analogy of water – and how precious and life-giving it is – to help us understand the 'Living Water' that he offered the Samaritan woman in the Gospel of St John chapter 4, and that He offers to all of us.

Take time to read and think about John 4:5-41 and consider the physical and spiritual thirst of the Samaritan woman. Consider Jesus' approach, showing dignity and compassion. What can we learn from Jesus?

Facts about water - include a couple of the following facts each week in your Parish bulletin as a reminder of why you are fundraising for the Real Gift of Water for a Village.

- 1 in 10 people around the world don't have access to clean drinking water that's around 785 million people
- 31% of schools around the world don't have access to clean water
- 1 million people die every year from diarrhoea because of unsafe drinking water around 297,000 are under 5 years old
- In the UK, even the water used to flush our toilets has been treated to the same level as our tap water
- It is estimated that by 2025, half of the world's population will be living in an area where water is scarce
- 4.5 billion people globally don't have a toilet in their home; 2 billion don't even share a toilet within their community
- Scientists estimate that the energy required to produce bottled water is roughly 2,000 times the energy required to produce tap water
- Women and children around the world spend over 200 million hours collecting water every day
