



1. St Columbkille's Church

Where the journey begins: SCIAF's birthplace in Rutherglen.

2. The River

Flowing from a Church doorway and winds through the whole landscape. It symbolises journey, connection and how faith can flow outward into action and service.

3. Monsignor Rooney & John McKee

The founding visionaries who first sowed this work of faith in action. John McKee, the teacher, can be seen in a pointing gesture inviting us to look at how this mission continues today.

4. St Columba/St Columbkille

A figure inspired by a statue in St Columbkille's church, he watches over the unfolding story of faith in action linking the early Church in Scotland with the mission of today.

5. Surfers

The children represent SCIAF's Surf for Peace project in Colombia. The oval shape of the surfboards echoes the halo shape of St Columba's headwear subtly linking faith and action.

6. Patchwork

The colourful patchwork fields represent many communities, stories and contributions woven together. The changing colours suggest growth, investment and flourishing over time.

7. Cherry Blossom Trees

Echoing the cherry trees outside St Columbkille's Church, they root the painting firmly in the real place where SCIAF's story began. They also point to the Trinity too and how integral God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit are in the Journey.

8. Stacked cubes

Represent SCIAF's WEE BOX appeal, symbolising generations of solidarity built through almsgiving.

9. Waterfall

The river flows through the WEE BOXES and pours out in waterfalls, showing that the mission continues and reaches far beyond what we can see.

10. SCIAF logo

The cherry trees include the SCIAF logo symbolising growth and the many ways the Church's mission continues to take root in communities around the world.
